Seminars/Workshops/Conferences/Teleconferences

Attending 1 CEU per hour of participation with a cap of 12 CEU for any one event.

Presenting/Writing 1 CEU per hour of research and preparation of seminar material seminar material with a cap of 12 CEU per any one seminar. (Note: seminars given many times in different locations are worth a 12 CEU yearly cap. A previously prepared seminar that is presented in subsequent years is worth half the original value up to one time per year.)

2007 IAABC Conference

Attending 15 CEU
Presenting 1 CEU for each presentation in addition to the 15 CEU's for attendance

University Courses From an Approved Institution (per quarter/semester course)

1 college credit equals 6 CEU (Note: there are no limitations or caps on the number of college courses, credits that may be taken in one year. A maximum of 30 credits may be carried over to the following two-year period. In other words, a full-time student in an appropriate behavior course may qualify for up to four years of CEU in a given year of full-time attendance.)

Course from a non-Accredited Program The applicant must send in both the IAABC application for approval and a syllabus of the course. Additional information may be required. A course is distinct from a workshop/seminar if it meets the following criteria:

- 1) Must be at least one week in length
- 2) Must have some kind of end evaluation
- 3) Must have a finite timeline in which the member must complete the work

No more than 20 CEU may be awarded for any non-accredited program.

Individual Research (must be published or presented)

10 – 30 CEU depending on the depth of the study

Literature Research (must be published or presented)

5 – 20 CEU depending on the depth of the research

Participation in the IAABC Journal

Authors 3-5 CEU depending on the depth of the article as determined by the journal review

Peer Review 1-3 CEU

Writing a Book (excluding humor, poems, reprinting of previously published work) 5-15 CEU depending on depth material is covered as determined by the division chair.

Co-authoring, editing or Contributing to a book (excluding humor, poems, reprinting of previously published work) 3 - 15 CEU depending on size and relevancy of contribution as determined by division chair.

Work as a Mentor with the IAABC

1-10 CEU for every 6 months of mentorship in addition IAABC set fee. CEU's will be set by Standards at the time the mentor is assigned the associate member the mentor will assist.

Participation on an IAABC Committee

CEU is still outstanding

Writing an Article for a Popular or Mainstream Publication: 2 CEU

Writing Regularly Scheduled Columns (print or online) *based on annual participation*

Daily: 6 CEU, weekly: 4 CEU, monthly: 2 CEU

Volunteering in the Capacity of a Behavior Consultant:

1 CEU for every 10 hours of volunteer time up to a cap of 5 CEU in a two-year period.

Teaching a College or University Course

7 CEU for every college credit allowed for the course up to a maximum of (i.e. a 5 credit quarterly course is equal to 35 CEU for that quarter. If the course is year long, it would be worth up to the maximum.) The course subject must be on some aspect of behavior.

Other Ways to Earn CEU

Members can earn CEU in other ways that are evaluated on an individual basis. Some members have already done that by helping division chairs with certain tasks. If you have an idea on a way to serve the IAABC or further your education, contact the education committee with your proposal or contact the division chair.
